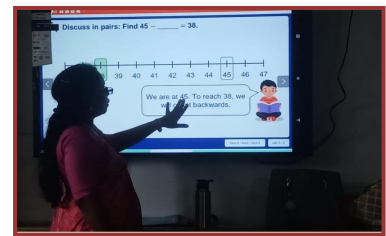


Warm Welcome: The school campus was adorned with colorful banners, decorations, and welcoming messages, creating an inviting atmosphere for all attendees.

16. TELUGU BASHA DINOTSAVAM - 29th August 2023 -

Telugu is one of India's six classical languages, spoken in the states of Andhra Pradesh and Telangana. Telugu, a Dravidian language, is also the official language of the states of Telangana and Andhra Pradesh.

The language is known as "The Italian of the East" because Niccol de Conti, a 16th-century Italian traveller, discovered that the Telugu language, like the Italian language, finishes with vowels.

Telugu Language Day was chosen on August 29 to coincide with the birthday of Telugu poet Gidugu Venkata Ramamurthy. During British rule, he was a Telugu writer and one of the first contemporary Telugu linguists and social visionaries. Ramamurthy was born on August 29, 1863, in the town of Parvatalapeta, Srikakulam. Ramamurthy's efforts resulted in Telugu becoming a standard language. As a result, Telugu is utilised as the medium of teaching, testing, and writing in schools and educational institutions.



Telugu basha dinostavam was organized by the Telugu Department of our school under the headship of Ms.Balamani & Ms.Chaitanya . A welcome dance depicting the importance of telugu basha was performed by students of class VI - VIII ." *Maa telugu talli ki malleae poo dhandha*" was echoing all over the place which aroused the feeling of motherly affection.A speech was delivered by Bhavith of Class IV.

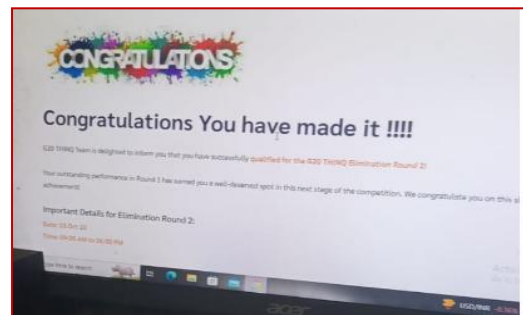

Hindi Day is celebrated in India to commemorate the date 14 September 1949 on which a compromise was reached, during the drafting of the Constitution of India on the languages that were to have official status in the Republic of India.

We, at St. Anthony's High School too celebrated the Hindi diwas with various activities in a special assembly that comprised of songs, a skit and a speech. The importance of Hindi language was well deciphered by the song and the dance displays.





22.JANMASHTAMI CELEBRATIONS - 06th September 2023

Krishna Janmashtami, also known simply as Krishnashtami, Janmashtami, or Gokulashtami, is an annual Hindu festival that celebrates the birth of Krishna, the eighth avatar of Vishnu.

We at St.Anthony's High School celebrated this festive day with little krishna's and Gopika's.

The cultural event included the displays of Krishna's dasha avatar dance performance including song performance from classes II to V .

In his speech the Director emphasized on the noble deeds of Krishna to be followed by the student community,



He spoke about the birth history of Lord Krishna and its significance . An event well cherished by all. Thanks to the organising committee.

23. GANESH CHATHURTHI - "Ganapathi bappa Maurya"



The auspicious Hindu festival of Ganesh Chaturthi is celebrated annually with pomp in India in almost all states . Also known as Vinayaka Chaturthi or Ganesh Utsav, the day marks the birth of Lord Ganesha and is observed for ten days by devotees. It falls annually on the Chaturthi tithi of Shukla Paksha. The last day of the 10-day celebrations is marked as Ganesh Visarjan. On this day, devotees immerse Lord Ganesha's idols in water.



Ganesh Chaturthi has four main rituals -- *Pranapratishta*, *Shodashopachara*, *Uttarpuja*, and *Visarjan* puja. People decorate their homes with flowers and rangoli designs and bring clay idols of Lord Ganesha, into their homes. Beautifully decorated Ganesh idols are also placed at puja pandals, homes, offices, and educational institutions on the day of Chaturthi.



The *Pranapratishta* ritual is performed by a priest by chanting a mantra. After that, 16 different rituals are performed - known as *Shodashopachara puja*. *Modak*, a popular sweet dumpling from Maharashtra, is said to be the favourite *prasad* of Lord Ganesha. *Modak* and other sweets and fruits are offered to Lord Ganesha during the puja.



People celebrate the festival by singing and playing religious hymns, dancing to drum beats, and preparing a delicious meal. The third main ritual of Ganesh Chaturthi is *Uttarpuja* - which is about bidding farewell to Lord Ganesha.



On the 10th and last day of Ganesh Chaturthi, the idol of Lord Ganesha is immersed in a nearby river with full devotion, and this ceremony is called *Ganesh Visarjan*. People chant "*Ganapati Bappa Morya, Purnima Varshi Laukariya*", which means "Goodbye Lord Ganesha, please come back next year."

A special assembly to invoke the blessings of Lord Ganesha

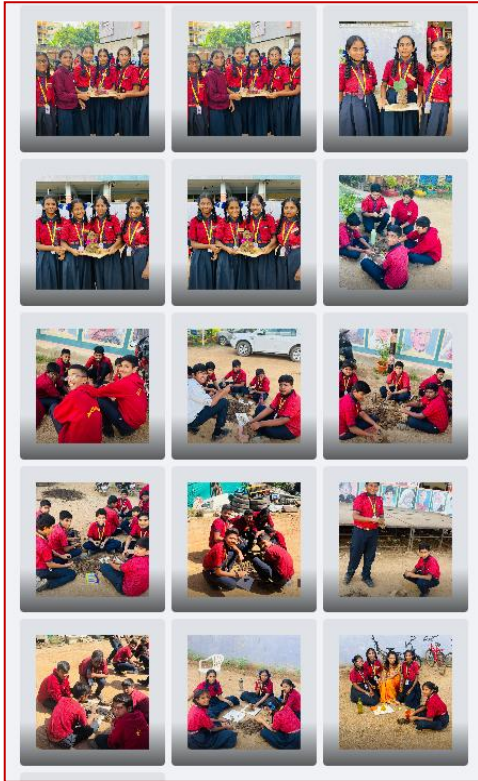
was done in our assembly on 16th September 2023. Prayer chanted with lighting of the lamp along with students dressed as Shiva, Parvathi and Lord Ganesha was a scene to be worth watching. Clay Model of Ganesh was installed, well decorated with flowers and prasadam kudumulu made with rice flour and jaggery were offered.



A dance sequel depicting the history of how Lord Ganesha got the elephant head was well displayed by Primary students of Class II and III. Our Director Mr.N.P.Sundara Raju along with Principal Ms. J.Sharmila

Christy attended the programme . In his speech the Director emphasized students to seek blessings of knowledge and wisdom from Lord Ganesha. 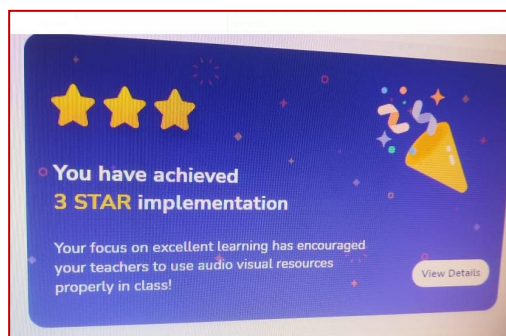

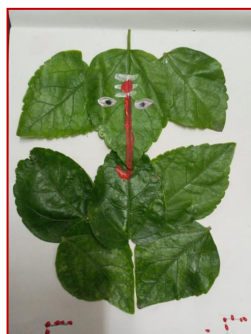
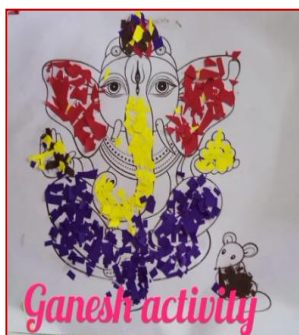
